### Scenarios

**Scenario 1:** A Creek warrior alerts the French that British troops are approaching; the French leave the fort to prepare an ambush. As the skirmish develops, the British conduct a fighting withdrawal and the engagement ends with the French retiring to Fort Toulouse. This scenario takes place in the field south of the British camp.

**Scenario 2:** The British are deployed for action as a French force approaches from the east. A linear battle develops between the two forces in the field south of the British camp. Musket volleys are fired and the scenario ends with a British bayonet charge; the French retire to Fort Toulouse.

**Scenario 3:** British forces attack Fort Toulouse. French artillery is fired in defense of the fort. A French sortie drives the British into the woods and the scenario ends.
